Armed with extensive knowledge and experience, she has created a patented process that helps professionals understand their client's hair so that they can provide customized hair care solutions.

In addition to her professional work, Dr. Porter's personal passion is educating and mentoring underrepresented youth about STEM opportunities. Dr. Porter is a wife and mother of two daughters. For fun, she loves jumping rope in the 40+ Double Dutch Club and working out at the gym.





Sausage and Bean Soup

Ingredients

- 1-2 Tbs Olive Oil
- 1/2 pound sliced Smoked Sausage (Kielbasa, Andouille, Italian)
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped green bell pepper
- 1 can each, Kidney Beans, Black Beans and Butter Beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can Diced Tomatoes (undrained)
- 1 can Low Sodium Beef or Chicken Broth
- 1/2 Tsp Garlic Powder
- Cajun or Italian Seasoning Blend, to taste (match with your sausage selection)
- 2—3 dashes of Worcestershire Sauce
- Hot Sauce, Salt and Black Pepper to taste.

Directions

- 1. Sauté the smoked sausage, onion and bell pepper in olive oil until the vegetables are softened.
- 2. Add the drained and rinsed canned beans, undrained tomatoes, broth and seasonings.
- 3. Simmer, covered for 30 40 minutes until seasonings have time to develop and the soup thickens slightly.
