

"Sultaines, A More Sustainable Replacement for Traditional Amphoterics"

By replacing a common petrochemical intermediate with a biobased substitute, a series of sultaine surfactants have been developed to replace traditional amphoterics, including betaines, with molecules demonstrating similar performance attributes (color, odor, foam characteristics, viscosity enhancement). The resultant products are high purity with higher solids, further reducing their environmental footprint. They also contain fewer impurities, exhibit lower inherent irritation, and have improved compatibility with hard water. End products are readily obtained from a wide variety of natural oil feedstocks. Therefore, additional products with previously unrealized benefits can also be obtained, including a high foaming amphoteric which does not rely on oil palm or coconut feedstocks and a liquid thickener for cleansers with excellent efficiency.

Revolutionary Disruptors Frame the Leading Trade Show & Conference for Innovations in Beauty and Personal Care Ingredients, Raw Materials and Formulations

Society of Cosmetic Chemists Celebrates 75 Years

This is a very special year for the Society of Cosmetic Chemists (SCC) as the organization celebrates its Diamond Jubilee. Founded in 1945, the SCC is the oldest and largest membership organization focused exclusively on cosmetic science education.

"After 75 years, the Society boasts one of the biggest footprints in the cosmetics and personal care industry," said Erica O'Grady, CAE, Executive Director/CEO of the Society. "With our international, national and local events, we are proud to represent the industry and the greater scientific community as a well-respected organization that has never strayed from its mission: to advance cosmetic science."

This past year, the SCC acquired a record 5,700+ members globally – with some of those memberships spanning as many as five decades – which speaks directly to the value of SCC membership. The last 75 years have featured seventy-three annual scientific meetings, two US-hosted international congresses with the International Federation of Societies of Cosmetic Chemists (IFSCC), two co-hosted intercontinental conferences with the Italian SCC, multiple industry partnership collaborations, and hundreds of education events presented domestically.

"When you reflect back on our history it is evident that education, innovation and collaboration are very important to the SCC," said Mindy Goldstein, the 74th SCC President and owner of Mindy S.
