

Abstract



Consumer needs in personal care cleaning are shifting rapidly and formulators are reorganizing their toolboxes to accommodate them. Surfactants are vitally important tools for the formulation of personal care products, functioning as foaming agents, cleansers, thickeners, emulsifiers, and solubilizers. This presentation will give a basic overview of surfactant chemistry and present a wide variety of technology options for the latest consumer claims, including "water-free", "sulfate-free", "PEG/dioxane-free", and lower irritation cleansing formulation. Surfactant functions in formulations, key functional groups, and important things to watch for will be discussed.



Member Spotlight

Martha Tate, Ph.D., Tate Science

This month's Member Spotlight features Martha Tate, Ph.D. Martha has 30 years of experience in cosmetics claims, and skin and hair research. At Kimberly -Clark Corporation, Martha's research supported claims for a wide variety of products (infant diapered skin, adult care, elder skin, feminine care, work wear, facial and bath tissue). She was Manager of Claims Substantiation for skin and hair care products at L'Oreal. She is known for hair research done while a scientist at TRI/Princeton.

Martha represented the US Society of Cosmetic Chemists (SCC) on the Executive Committee of the Praesidium of the International Federation of Societies of Cosmetic Chemists. During Martha's two terms on the SCC's Committee on Scientific Affairs, she served as Chair of that committee. She is active on the Board of Directors of the International Society of Biophysics and Skin Imaging (ISBS).

What is your favorite part about being a member of the SCC?

The SCC is very open and supportive to everyone. I was a young scientist visiting various scientific groups for my Postdoctoral Fellowship, at TRI/Princeton. I found the national SCC meeting to be very friendly. I knew no one, yet there were people reaching out greet me and support me as a new industry employee. I met mentors who stayed with me throughout my career. One is Randy Wickett, still advising and helping me as needed, after 30 years.

What do you consider to be your greatest accomplishment to date?

I was on the IFSCC Executive Committee on the Praesidium. Amy Wyatt was the upcoming President, so this was about 2014 or 2015. The IFSCC office had been in London for years and a change of location was being considered. Amy and I supported the move to New York. There were other locations being considered for the home office. The Praesidium had a vote on location, and New York won! Amy and I were in a state of very happy shock.

What is the most important skill you have developed in your career?

Knowing how much I can manage and still be successful and sane. I can run a 3 ring circus, not a 5 ring circus! You have to sit in the hall and wait until a ring opens. You have to be ready, too. Have your product and safety clearance for testing on humans before you can enter a clinical or consumer study.

What is one item you cannot live without?

Salad! In my family I am called "The Rabbit". Because I can eat a family sized salad, and the rest have to get their salad first before Mom gets hold of it.

In your mind, who in this industry can serve as a good role model?

Amy Wyatt, VP at Chanel, she worked her way up. She is very skilled at gaining cooperation from opposing forces. They're smiling and making progress, and they don't even realize Amy did it! I saw her in action on the IFSCC Praesidium. Wow.
